Lianyungang is right on the Yellow Sea, north-eastern Jiangsu. Though there are many attractions, three main features stand out:

1 - Wildlife and Greens

In Lianyungang (LYG) visitors can find areas of Pere David's Deer, one of Jiangsu's emblematic animals. Visitors can also hike up Bloom Mountain, Huaguoshan. This area, tallest peak of Jiangsu, is covered by lush greens, fruits and flowers.

2 - History

LYG is also historically important since it was and is a major water transport hub. In addition to that, LYG is the setting for scenes of The Monkey King / Journey to the West.

3 - Beach and Yellow Sea

Opposite to the Lianyungang Harbour, you will see Lian Island. If you are planning a short trip, this

place should be top of the list. If you want to get away from city life and reconnect with nature, it's your ideal choice. About 80% of the island is covered in thick forests and sandy beaches, marking where land meets water.

If you want to go, we recommend you go soon. Late October weather isn't as pleasurable. During this month and the next, weather is cooler and provides for enjoyable days of walks along the beach, fun and games. You'll also want to visit places like the Dashawan Amusement Park and Sumawan Ecology Garden.
